Thank you for the opportunity to make a submission to the implementation review of the Planning and Design Code. I am hopeful that the expert panel will meet community expectations by listening attentively and acting on the feedback given.

I am concerned about the impact of both the current code and our poor regulations on tree canopies right across Adelaide. The Value of Trees has never been taken into consideration and yet given the climate crises we all face it needs to be a serious part of the planning code.

You are no doubt familiar with the significant body of work published by the Conservation Council of SA and partner organisations over the last 2 years. Using an evidence-based approach, these reports highlighted how impoverished our laws have become since 2011 when significant exemptions were added to them, despite protests from both the community and experts.

The Conservation Council and partner organisations have compiled a list of their top ten priorities for reform. Support of these improvements will help make our state's tree regulations best practice, a Labor election practice. Many of the changes are backed up not only by the CCSA reports but also by the independent report commissioned by the State Planning Commission - I ask you to support these changes.

We cannot underestimate the important role that trees play in our daily lives. We need them more than they need us. By doing so you will improve our mental & physical health, clean the air that we breathe, remove carbon dioxide from the atmosphere, help cool our homes and streets, make our city more livable and mitigate the impacts of climate change for our children and grandchildren.

We are at a vital point to make change for the better. We need to fully understand and appreciate trees play a significant role in not only removing and reducing emissions but also protecting our current fragile ecosystems. Therefore the sooner we can implement these recommendations the sooner we can repair the damage that has already occurred.

I voted for Labor for the very first time. I voted for Labor because I believed that you as a party would take us to a better future. Not only in the area of planning and development but also in protecting our trees and nature for generations to come.
