Thank you for the opportunity to make a submission to the implementation review of the Planning and Design Code. The Conservation Council and partner organisations have compiled a list of their top ten priorities for reform. Support of these improvements will help make our state's tree regulations best practice, a Labor election practice. Many of the changes are backed up not only by the CCSA reports but also by the independent report commissioned by the State Planning Commission - I ask you to support these changes.

I live in Rosewater and am a proud owner of 6 huge pre-settlement red gums, an enormous native pine tree as well as two incredibly tall cotton palms and two huge Canary Island Date Palms. While current lax regulations could be used to support removal of some of these trees, I would not dream of doing so. However, pruning and maintaining these trees cost me thousands of dollars which I can ill afford, being a pensioner living on a limited income. I urge the council to consider implementing grants to support maintenance of significant trees and to employ an arborist to provide free advise to residents.
