Subject: Submission to the Review of The Planning Code

Thank you for the opportunity to make a submission to the implementation review of the Planning and Design Code. I am hopeful that the expert panel will meet community expectations by listening attentively and acting on the feedback given.

I am concerned about Private Mines, and their ability in law to mine within 500m of private homes. Please consider a minimum separation distance of 500m between Private Mines and community, especially in residential area. The proposed expansion of White Rock Quarry in Horsnell comes to mind. They are proposing to mine within 500 of private property.

I am also concerned that our planning laws are not adequately considering the impacts of climate change, and that we are still promoting building and population rises in areas which will be subject to greater insurance liabilities because of climate risk.

Furthermore I am concerned about the impact of both the code and our poor regulations on tree canopy right across Adelaide. You are no doubt familiar with the significant body of work published by the Conservation Council of SA and partner organisations over the last 2 years. Using an evidence-based approach, these reports highlighted how impoverished our laws have become since 2011 when significant exemptions were added to them, despite protests from both the community and experts.

The Conservation Council and partner organisations have compiled a list of their top ten priorities for reform. Support of these improvements will help make our state's tree regulations best practice, a Labor election practice. Many of the changes are backed up not only by the CCSA reports but also by the independent report commissioned by the State Planning Commission - I ask you to support these changes.

We cannot underestimate the important role that trees play in our daily lives. We need them more than they need us. By doing so you will improve our mental & physical health, clean the air that we breathe, remove carbon dioxide from the atmosphere, help cool our homes and streets, make our city more livable and mitigate the impacts of climate change for our children and grandchildren.
