We live in Henley Street in Mile End, which is an inner western suburb of Adelaide, South Australia. We are a home owner and have resided in the area for over 15 years and enjoy the vibrant and diverse community and the beautiful heritage houses that makes this a unique place to call home.

We have recently been advised that the State Government is proposing to rezone our section of Mile End, and neighbouring suburbs of Torrensville, Cowandilla and Hilton, into a newly created zone called 'Housing Diversity neighbourhood zone'. There is no rational reason for this proposal.

We are against the proposal and do NOT want our area to be a 'Housing Diversity Neighbourhood Zone' and think it is more appropriate for it to be classified as a 'Suburban Neighbourhood Zone' in keeping with the rest of Mile End, Torrensville and Thebarton.

We object STRONGLY to the proposal and wish for the State Government to reconsider its rezone proposal.
