The Plan will show where houses will go.




The Plan will show where offices and factories will be built.

There will be ideas about how to look after important jobs like fishing, mining and farming to make sure there are lots of jobs in the area.



It will have ideas about how we can look after plants, animals, beaches, national parks, farmland and the environment.



The Plan will also make sure there is a lot of holiday accommodation for visitors.
