I am writing to express my displeasure to learn that my neighborhood is going to be zoned as a Housing Diversity Neighborhood.

I first purchased my home at [REDACTED], Mile End in 2013, the building was 100 years old that year, and while it was a bit run down we spent considerable amounts of money to renovate while still maintaining the beautiful stone character of the home. The majority of our street and the surrounding Neighborhood for several blocks are similar old stone houses.

We often have interstate guests stay and they often comment about the beautiful stone houses we have in Adelaide and how lucky we are to have maintained the character we have.

I was saddened then to learn that under the current planned zoning this character is under threat.

As such I urge you to reconsider the zoning of our Neighborhood at Cowra St Mile End to instead be zoned as a Suburban Neighborhood Zone.
